“Six years ago I came to the Center to learn how to sew but when the primary school was opened I was placed in the final year of primary school. By God's grace I passed my exams and went to secondary school. Next year I will be my last year at the secondary school.”

“I am so very happy and thankful to God. Before I came to the ACTS Center, I had nothing. I felt like my life was over and could not see beyond the hunger and lack.”

You make the difference

I was contemplating whether to reduce the number of students and teachers at our schools and evaluating the cost per student for food, clothing, medical care and tuition. Two days before the end of school I decided to interview individual students to see how they felt about their own lives.

Each one confirmed that they wouldn't be able to attend school outside the ACTS Center. Some have relatives who abuse them. In their own way, each said they could never go back to a life of hopelessness. ACTS had transformed their lives. And the process was on-going.

As the children spoke to me, they shared stories of their past and how ACTS has changed even the

way they think about life. Young girls and boys shared their vision to help other children find freedom from poverty and ignorance.

This transformation comes with your partnership in prayer and giving. We are grateful for all you have done. Children who were once forgotten and left orphan, like Didier, Mariam, Jocelyn, Aliou, Joseph and Bob, know they have worth in God's eyes and are excited about their future.

We are thankful to God that we were able to finish the school year with good results (93% of students succeeded in their exams).

For the new school year, Rakiéta will be going to a professional school to become a nurse. Her plan is to work at ACTS' Ellel Medical Center.

Graduates from vocational training received certificates and a surprise gifts. Sewing machines were given to girls who completed the seamstress course and exam. Young men who graduated from the carpentry shop received a set of tools to begin their own shop. Pray for the success of the graduates' new businesses.
